Welcome to RVMC's third annual survey of the best picks for families in Marin! Thank you to the 104 moms who took the time to complete the survey in February – we could not have done this without your recommendations!

Before jumping into the results, first some detail about RVMC members (although remember, this is only based on a section of the membership).

Where do we live?

The trend over the last three years has been for more RVMC members to have paid work. The number of stay-at-home moms has declined from 40% in 2006 to 37% this year. More members now work full time (20% this year up from 16% in 2006), less members work part-time (23% this year down from 31% in 2006) and more members work on a freelance basis (20% this year compared to 13% in 2006).

As for children, 48% have one child, 46% have two children, 4% have three children, one respondent has more than five children and another respondent is pregnant with her first child.

2.7 Mi., easy and scenic

Sir Francis Drake to Lagunitas to end at Natalie Coffin Greene Park. Free Parking.

Walk .2 mi. uphill to trail around lake starting at stairs at side of dam.

2. Tennessee Valley – Mill Valley

4 Mi. to end of trail and back. Gently winding trail open to hikers and bicyclists. Great place for viewing lots of wildlife.

In Mill Valley, take Tennessee Valley Road for 1.5 mi. until the road ends at the trailhead carpark.

3. Lake Lagunitas – Fairfax

< 2 Mi., easy, scenic

Sir Francis Drake to left at Alpha gas station, right on Broadway, left on Bolinas - Fairfax Rd., left on Sky Oaks to ranger station, follow signs to lake. \$ Parking. Trailhead by picnic area.

4. Crown Road – Kentfield to Mill Valley

5+ Mi., easy, scenic fire road, jogger stroller friendly

Sir Francis Drake to College to Woodland to Evergreen to left on Crown Rd. to end.

Trail spur options (not for strollers) off Crown Road: Hoo Koo ee Koo, Dawn Falls down to Baltimore Canyon.

BEST PARK/PLAYGROUNDS IN MARIN

1. **San Anselmo Memorial Park** (also known as Millennium Playground). This popular park is the result of a huge community effort. The result is two divided areas – one for toddlers and one for big kids. Lots of slides, sand pits and swings, including a lounge swing that is very popular with moms. Located at San Francisco Boulevard and Veterans Place, San Anselmo.

2. **Corte Madera Town Park** (also known as "Pixley Park". Highly recommended enclosed playground with a space for toddlers and another space for older kids. A miniature 'road' encircles the area and is a great place for your little one to learn to ride a bike. Located at Pixley Avenue and Redwood Avenue, Corte Madera.

3. **Pixie Park**, a volunteer co-operative playground for children six and under, has lots of RVMC members. Located in Marin Art and Garden Center, 30 Sir Francis Drake Boulevard, Ross. The park is unique in that it is gated requiring a key to get in and to get out, thereby ensuring that children will not leave without their parents' knowledge. The park has fun, safe play structures and swings for babies and bigger children, as well as a kitchen, bathroom, diaper changing area and beautiful trellises that shade picnic tables, big and small. 4. **Peri Park**. This is a favorite gathering spot for moms groups. Different structures for different age groups so your child can grow with the park. Nice to stroll around to Fairfax Scoop afterwards for an ice cream or pick up your coffee at the Roastery before heading to the park. Located at Bolinas Avenue and Park, Fairfax.

BEST LOW-COST ACTIVITY (UNDER \$10) TO DO WITH YOUR CHILDREN IN MARIN

Hiking was, once again the stand-out favorite low-cost activity of all the active moms out there! San Rafael Farmers Market (coupled with feeding the ducks and having a picnic at the nearby playground) was another popular pick. The Bay Area Discovery Museum (especially if you have membership) also got nominated several times in this category as well.

Parks were also a popular option with special mention going to Terra Linda Water Park for hot days.

Many moms love a day trip to one of the fabulous beaches. The favorites included Stinson, Limatour and Heart's Desire beaches.

The Fairfax Pavilion indoor play program also rated several mentions.

BEST KID-FRIENDLY RESTAURANT IN MARIN

For the third year running, **Easy Street Café** took top honors as the best kid-friendly restaurant in Marin.

1. **Easy Street Café**, Two locations: Red Hill Shopping Center in San Anselmo and 574 Magnolia Ave, Larkspur. Easy Street Cafe is a family-oriented restaurant specializing in lunch and breakfast that was opened in Larkspur in 1984. Reasonable prices and good-sized portions are second to the play area full of toys as top feature.

2. **California Pizza Kitchen**, 347 Corte Madera Town Centre, Corte Madera. Tel: 945-0401

Offers deservedly renowned pizzas that suit the pickiest of palates as well as varieties more appealing to adults. Service is fast (great with little ones) and friendly. Its location means that it can get crowded at lunchtimes and early dinner when families stream in from shopping. Kid's menu is more extensive than the standard one offered in seemingly every restaurant and includes healthier options like chicken breast and sides of salad and fruit.

3. **Iron Springs Brewery**, 765 Center Boulevard, Fairfax. Tel: 485-1005

A casual dining spot that makes all of its handcrafted beers and sodas. They offer a variety of dishes including burgers, salads and large plate dinners. A kids menu is offered and on Tuesdays one kid eats free with each paying adult.

4. **Yankee Pier**, 286 Magnolia Ave, Larkspur. Tel: 924-7676
Casual and intimate, this quaint New England-style eatery is set in a small yellow house that seats about 50 people, with room

for another couple dozen on the front and back porches. Very popular, this is a relatively small ("cozy" in reviews) restaurant specializing in seafood. You can't make reservations so be aware that there can be a wait if you arrive during peak times. Offers all-you-can-eat fish and chips on Monday's (described as the "best in the area" by the San Francisco Chronicle). And they have a sandbox for kids to play in before, during and after dinner.

Fun, colorful and casual, this local favorite is tucked away on a side street and has both an outdoor and indoor section. Great Mexican food with something for even the pickiest of palettes.

Each day offers a balance of structured and unstructured play as children encounter all the elements of a traditional nursery school curriculum: art, language, music, movement and dramatic play, Jewish holidays and Jewish culture. Take bikes with you as there is a great road to explore on two wheels (but watch out for speedy adult cyclists as they come racing through).

Tongue-tie, also known as ankyloglossia, is a condition in babies and children who have a short or taut lingual frenulum at birth -- the piece of skin that joins the tongue to the floor of the mouth. The tongue then remains anchored to the bottom of the mouth, restricting movement. This prevents the ability to protrude the tongue past the lower lip. As a result, infants and children with tongue-tie may experience speech or eating problems, such as difficulty with breastfeeding. The etiology is unknown but it can run in families.

Babies with tongue-tie may experience problems with breastfeeding because they are unable to “latch on” to their mother’s nipple or cause extreme discomfort for the nursing mother. Some breastfeeding mothers may not realize that tongue-tie is the underlying cause. In severe cases, this may cause feeding problems and poor weight gain. If you experience trouble breastfeeding with your baby, it is important that you have an evaluation for tongue-tie. Lactation consultants are very familiar with this problem and can make this assessment.

The tongue is also a very important muscle involved in speaking. For many children with tongue-tie, the tongue is able to compensate and they will not experience any speech impediments. However, some children’s speech will be affected by the condition. Around the ages of two, speech problems may become noticeable. If you do have concerns about your child’s articulation, it is important to bring this up to your pediatrician who may refer you to a speech pathologist.

For older children, tongue tie may be associated with inability to lick an ice cream cone, play a wind instrument, or French-kiss.

In some instances, tongue-tie does not require treatment. However, if your baby is experiencing feeding difficulties, or your toddler is experiencing speech problems, a simple and effective surgery, also known as frenuloplasty, may be recommended. Risks of frenuloplasty are very low but may include pain, bleeding or infection. The technique used for the procedure depends on your child’s age.

For young babies, the procedure can be performed without a general anesthetic. During the procedure, your baby’s head is held and the frenulum is simply snipped with surgical scissors in the office. After the operation, your baby will be able to breastfeed right away, though advice from a lactation consultant may still be needed.

For older children, a general anesthetic is usually required. Stitches are usually placed and it may take a few weeks for the mouth to heal completely.

Breastfeeding can be an exhausting and frustrating experience for new moms. Tongue tie is easy to identify and treat if it is felt to be contributing and allow Mom and her baby to have a more positive bonding experience in those early weeks.
